Notes

1. Gift Aid enables the Charity to recover the tax you have paid on the donation you have given to that Charity and therefore increase the value of the donation.

2. You must pay an amount of income tax and/or capital gains tax (council tax and VAT do not count) at least equal to the tax the Charity reclaims on your donations in the tax year (currently 25p for each £1 you give)

If you are already a basic rate taxpayer (or paying enough tax at the lower rate to cover the tax recovered), your donation will be deemed to have had the tax already paid. *You will not be liable to pay any more than the donation you choose to make.*

3. If you pay tax at the higher rate you can claim further tax relief in your Self Assessment Tax return, this being the difference between the higher rate of tax and the basic rate.
